#### Decoding the region

North-East India has been attracting scholars and academicians around the world because of its rich socio-cultural and ecological treasure trove. Not many regions around the world can boast of such a diversity of culture, ethnicity and Nature that marks the region. The book, *Overview: North East India*, edited by Sikhamoni Konwar, is a significant academic statement presenting an overview on North-East India, encompassing a wide spectrum of some issues and concerns having much present-day academic relevance. The scope of deliberation and observation of the book is consolidated by as many as 22 academic writings by 25 eminent historians, social scientists, academicians, administrators (with in-field experience on North-East India), and scholars from India and abroad who have already carved a niche in their respective fields.

Writings like "Account of Assam in History of Kingdom of Siam" by Prof J N Phukan; "Techno-culture of North-East India: Some Aspects" by Prof Amarendra Kumar Thakur; "The Physical and Human Environment of Sikkim State within the Geographical area of Eastern Himalayan" by Olivier Chiron; "Glimpses of Assam in Post-Independence India" by S P Kar; "Theorising the Changing Terrain of Popular Culture of NE India" by Meeta Deka; "Rock-cut Sculptures of Guwahati" by Prof Paromita Das; "Ashta-Dikpalas in the Art of Kamrup District of Assam" by Deepi Rekha Kauli, etc., have presented different aspects of North-East India concerning the past and the present changing scenario through their research-based analysis and critical approaches. Prof Phukan's writing has brought an unknown account of Assam to the notice of the academic circle involved in the study of Assam history. Again, Prof Thakur has shown how technology and culture of North-East India have interaction between the two.

There is no doubt that the book has encompassed almost all the important facets of North-East India. However, it could have been further amplified with some more articles on some other issues like textile, wildlife, music, etc., of the region. Notwithstanding this, *Overview: North East India* will surely be an important addition to the growing academic research ventures on North-East India. Besides, in view of the increasing significance of the North-East region in the context of India's "Act East Policy" and its historical and ethnic affinity with China, Myanmar and other South-East Asian countries, the book will go a long way to excite constructive interest towards the North-East in the minds of the discerning readers and researchers.

## Japanese students visit city college

GUWAHATI, Jan 30: Karmashree Hiteswar Saikia College organised a students' interactive programme on Thursday with three visiting students from Japan, said a press release.

Principal of the college Dr Sikhamoni Konwar who inaugurated the programme, threw light on the significance of bilateral ties and exchange programmes between India and Japan.

One of the visiting students Kohei Kimura, who

delivered his speech in Hindi, spoke on the work culture of the Japanese people. The other two visiting students Tatsuya Nakao and Nozomi Nyuwa spoke on the geography and education system of Japan respectively. The interactive session was attended by the students, teachers and alumni of the college.

All the three students were from Ehime University, Japan, the release further said.

# International webinar at Hiteswar Saikia College

GUWAHATI, June 13: The International Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Kamakhya Hiteswar Saikia College here organised an international webinar on the topic "Sign of Education During COVID-19 Pandemic in Morocco" on Sunday, said a press release.

Prof Perennia Dik, visiting professor at the Institut des Sciences Humaines, Mohammed V University, Rabat, Morocco and former HOD, History Gauhati University, delivered the lecture on the topic as the resource person. In her speech, Prof Dik made a cursory request into different aspects of Morocco's historical background, social and cultural orientation, and its prevalent education system. She highlighted how Morocco has tried to cope with the difficulties posed by the present COVID-19 pandemic situation in the field of education, especially the hardships that the students face with the shift to the virtual mode of online teaching. In Morocco only 48 per cent of the families with children enrolled in primary school, 51 per cent in junior high school, 69 per cent in higher school and 56 per cent in higher education could follow lessons using digital platform. In contrast, children in 18 per cent of families do not follow the lessons at all, Prof Dik added. She called upon all the teachers to come up with innovations to make the online classes interesting for the students, and at the same time, refrain from overburdening them with too much of online activities considering the health hazards the electronic gadgets might have upon them.

Earlier, inaugurating the webinar, Dr. Siddhamoni Konwar, Principal of the host college, threw light on the importance of studying and understanding the impact of COVID-19 situation in areas concerning education in different parts of the world so that strategies can be framed to deal with it in India's context. She asserted that knowing about Morocco's education scenario in this direction, a long way in this direction.

The webinar was attended by many participants from different parts of Assam and the rest of the country, the USA, Morocco and other parts of the world.

Prof Dik's lecture was followed by an interactive session among the participants that included students and academicians from the USA and Morocco. The entire session was coordinated by Dr. Ranjan Kumar Bhatta, Coordinator, IQAC of the college. Dr. Anup Kumar Deka offered the vote of thanks.
